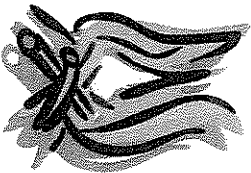

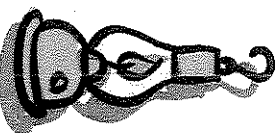

## Location



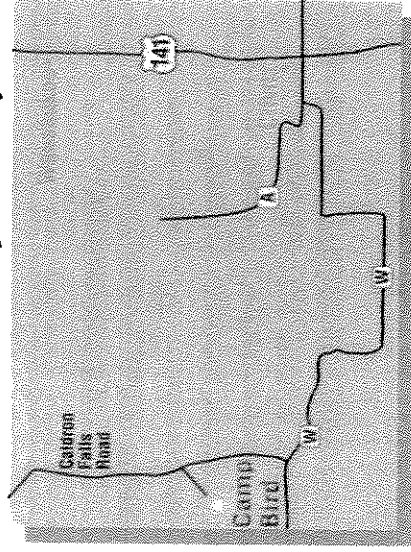

For convenience, the camp has full kitchen facilities, showers, flush toilets, and electricity.

14.5 miles west of Crivitz

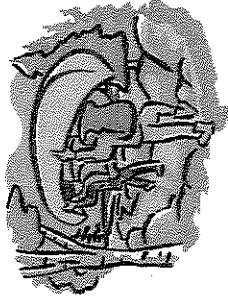
50 miles east of Antigo

## Campers



Students that will be attending grades 6-10 in fall 2008 and have an interest in the outdoors are encouraged to attend. Both Wisconsin and Michigan residents are welcome.

## Registration Fee

The fee for camp is \$50 per student. It covers food, lodging, instruction, educational materials and insurance. Once we receive registration payment, campers will get more information about camp, including what to bring, the daily schedule, and other relevant materials.

## Scholarships

Marinette County Land & Water Conservation is offering four scholarships to students living or attending school in Marinette County. Interested students are required to write a 100-200 word essay titled "My Most Memorable Outdoor Experience." (Please write real-life events, not fictional stories.) Winners will be chosen based on the content of their essay. We prefer that these essays be typed; handwritten essays will be accepted, but if illegible they will be disqualified. contact your own county's conservation office to see if they have other scholarship opportunities available.

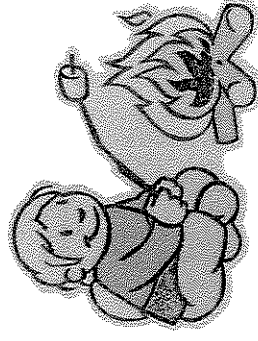
## Parents & Teachers
