

Dear Parents,



## Web Site Info

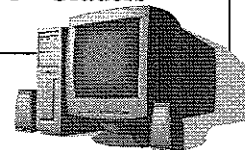

The form we use is required by the Diocese.

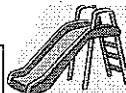
The person(s) in charge of the field trip takes the forms along in case they need to be referenced, that is, the critical information on the second page should a situation arise.

## *A Lenten Prayer Called the Passion*

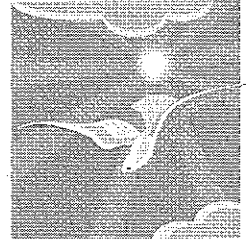


*Dear Lord Jesus,

and Your Mother was entrusted to the beloved disciple.*

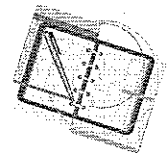
*Stretched out on the Cross,
