


Dear Parents,

School safety is a primary concern at KCSS. When we are made aware of possible safety issues, an investigation takes place by school personnel.

In minor incidences that occur during school, the matter is handled at the school level and corrective action is taken. In major incidences, the police conduct an investigation in concert with school administration. This investigation is extremely thorough, as warranted by the incident. Charges may be filed if a law has been broken.

Based on their investigation, the police department will notify us if there are any security concerns and make recommendations, if needed, to ensure the safety of our students and staff. The Diocesan Education office is consulted regarding serious discipline issues to ensure that the law and Diocesan Policies are followed.
